We will make Chester known for having a vibrant visual arts scene by investing in a cultural programme and events like the new Chester Contemporary. Working with local people and organisations, we will bring international artists and new heritage experiences to our city.




REFRESH FOR THE NORTHGATE ARENA


collection, street cleaning, libraries, leisure centres, planning, grass cutting and everything else the council does.
