SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL

We will work with Woodfall and St Winefride's schools to ensure kids can walk to school and cross our roads safely, this will reduce pollution around the schools and help keep our residential and main roads safe.



COASTAL FOOTPATH

We'll build a new coastal footpath between Parkgate and Little Neston, so that people can enjoy a nice walk as part of a national network of coastal footpaths. We will also dredge the marsh to reduce the risk of flooding



A NEW MEMORIAL FOR MINERS

There is a rich history of mining in Little Neston and Ness which needs to be remembered. We will create a new memorial to commemorate the lives of local coal miners and their families, all as part of our regeneration plans for the area.



KEEPING OUR BUSES& TRAINS MOVING

We will improve the Wrexham-Bidston line by working with Transport For Wales and Merseyrail. This will mean faster and more frequent rail services. Our bus services keep us connected and I will ensure they keep running.



FINDING NEW USES FOR OLD PUBS

We will work with the community and partners to find new uses for old pubs such as the Wheatsheaf Inn in Ness so they don't stand empty. We will deliver a regeneration masterplan for Neston in partnership with residents, businesses, the Town Council and community organisations.
