#### BRINGING BACK OUR POST OFFICE

“It was such a great result to get Post Office services back in our town after they had been withdrawn. Working together with the Town Council, we were able to get a service on Tuesdays and Fridays. “Having these services on our high street is important for the future of our town centre.”

#### RE-OPENING NESTON CIVIC HALL

“It has been a really big and important project for our town to get Civic Hall re-opened in partnership with NCYC. “I was really happy to commit £3,000 from my community budget to the project as I know that local people have been keen to see the building in use again.”

#### NEIGHBOURHOOD PRIDE PROJECTS

“We delivered the first council homes in our borough for 40 years including at Lois Bulley House in Romney Close. On the Liverpool Road estate, The Green and Churchill Court we completed a project to create new parking spaces for residents, fix fences and gates, and improve public areas.”

#### ROAD SAFETY PROGRAMME

“Labour promised a road safety programme as part of a campaign for a safer crossing on the A540. “We are delivering on that promise, with speed assessments, traffic calming and the new crossing at Raby Park Road/A540, which will be completed later this year.”

## REGENERATION MASTERPLAN

We will deliver a regeneration masterplan for Neston in partnership with residents, businesses, the Town Council and community organisations, all as part of a wider market towns regeneration programme in Cheshire West.

## COASTAL FOOTPATH

We'll build a new coastal footpath between Parkgate and Little Neston, so that people can enjoy a nice walk as part of a national network of coastal footpaths. We will also dredge the marsh to reduce the risk of flooding.

## A NEW MEMORIAL FOR MINERS

There is a rich history of mining in Little Neston and Ness which needs to be remembered. We will create a new memorial to commemorate the lives of local coal miners and their families, all as part of our regeneration plans for the area.

## KEEPING OUR BUSES & TRAINS MOVING

We will improve the Wrexham-Bidston line by working with Transport For Wales and Merseyrail. This will mean faster and more frequent rail services. Our bus services keep us connected and I will ensure they keep running.

## FIND A NEW FUTURE FOR OLD PUBS

We will work with the community and landlords to find new uses for old pubs like The Lodestar and Wheatsheaf Inn, so they don't stand empty in our town.
