

CAMPAIGN FOR BETTER PUBLIC TRANSPORT

66 Arriva's bus services have been unreliable for years and are now under threat. Northwich Railway Station lacks disabled access. I will fight for better bus services in Northwich and for a railway station fit for the 21st century. I will campaign for a devolution deal to take control of our buses."



EVENTS THAT BRING PEOPLE TOGETHER AND SUPPORT THE **TOWN CENTRE**

66 I'm proud of our record in working with a range of partners to bring free events to the town centre that the whole family can enjoy. Events like Krazv Races and Now Northwich boost the town whilst providing a cheap day out for families. I'll continue to support this."



CREATE MORE SAFE WALKING AND CYCLING ROUTES

66 I will work with Council Officers and Active Travel England to deliver more traffic-free walking and cycling routes in town. I will introduce more dropped kerbs to improve access for mobility scooters, and I'm determined to make getting to our schools safer and less polluted."



PROTECT AND IMPROVE OUR PARKS AND OPEN SPACES

REDUCE THE IMPACT OF THE WASTE **TREATMENT WORKS**

COMPLETION OF THE TOWN CENTRE REGENERATION

We will deliver the next phase of demolition and regeneration of the Weaver Square area of the town centre.

We will bring forward our plans to move Northwich Market into a new home in the heart of Barons Quay, and we'll work with businesses and partners to drive more footfall into the town centre.



COMPLETE THE LIBRARY RENOVATION

Stabilisation works to the library are now well underway by a specialist heritage contractor.

Once finished, we will complete the renovation of the inside of the library to deliver new facilities and services at this iconic town centre building.



HELP AND SUPPORT WITH THE COST OF LIVING CRISIS

We will continue to fund support services for people who are struggling to make ends meet, and we will work together with community food groups to make life more affordable for people on low incomes, build stronger communities and reduce food waste.



TACKLING ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

We will continue to work with the Police to tackle anti-social behaviour, including funding for community safety wardens and investing in CCTV in public places. We will also identify funding opportunities for new youth services, so that young people have things to do in our town.



FIND A SOLUTION TO TOWN CENTRE FLOODING

Recent town centre floods were caused by the highest-ever recorded river levels preventing the storm drains discharging into the river.

We have commissioned a new catchment model to find the right solution to this problem and we will work with partners to see it delivered.
